BAYLOR LICENSING AGREEMENT

The Baylor Licensing Agreement allows the Martin Museum of Art to publish images of your artwork, or images of work you have researched. We use this legal document as an agreement between you, the Museum, and Baylor University to facilitate the printing of the exhibition catalog.

BASIC INFORMATION

Studio Artists By signing this agreement, you allow the Martin Museum to publish your work in a printed and digital version of the exhibition catalog at no charge.

You will retain the copywrite to your work. This only allows the Museum to publish on the occasion of the exhibition.

Art Historians Images of work you research should be properly credited.

The Martin Museum is happy to work directly with institutions if needed, or you can arrange for image rights and reproduction.

Some institutions or organizations have specific legal documents to sign. Please consult with Martin Museum staff to ensure we are meeting the needs of these organizations.

AGREEMENT FOR REPRODUCING WORK

THIS AGREEMENT made by and between Baylor University, a Texas nonprofit corporation ("Baylor") and Robbie Barber ("Licensor").

1. <u>Grant of Permission</u>. Licensor hereby grants to Baylor, and Baylor accepts, the non-exclusive right and license to reproduce and publish images of Licensor's artwork, throughout the world in any media now known or hereafter developed, in a catalog to be offered to the public by Baylor to help support Baylor's Martin Museum of Art. The catalog is expected to be published on or about January 18, 2022. A copy or description of the Licensor's artwork to be included in the catalog is attached and referred to hereafter as the "Work."

This grant of permission covers the copyrights and any other rights that Licensor has in the Work and is made in exchange for good and valuable consideration, including Licensor's agreement to allow Baylor to use the Work for the mutual benefit of both parties; that is, the Licensor receives the benefit of having Licensor's artwork displayed for exposure to the public through the catalog, and Baylor receives the benefit of having the Licensor's artwork displayed in the catalog that it will sell to the public with the proceeds supporting Baylor's Martin Museum of Art; as well as the mutual covenants and representations contained herein.

- 2. <u>The Use</u>. Baylor's use of the Work for such catalog includes the right and license to make, reproduce, and distribute print, digital, or other available media copies of the Work to the public in the catalog, through any media now known or hereafter developed, including the internet, throughout the universe.
- 3. <u>Term.</u> This license shall remain in effect for the duration of the copyright of the Work unless sooner modified or terminated by mutual written agreement of the parties.
- 4. <u>Miscellaneous</u>. Licensor warrants and represents that the Work is original and does not and will not infringe upon or violate the rights of any third party.
- 5. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with and governed by the law of the State of Texas in the United States of America without regard to conflicts of law principles.




1. A signatory will receive an email from DocuSign requesting signature.




 To review and sign the contract, click on the "Review Document" link in the message content.




3. If someone else from the organization needs to sign the contract, click on "Assign to Someone Else" under "Other Actions."




 Check the box agreeing to use electronic records and signatures and click "Continue."




 Review the contract and click on the "Initial" tabs to initial in any place requiring initials.




6. Click on the "Sign" tab to sign the contract.




 Adopt a signature style or draw a signature, then click "Adopt and Sign."




Click "Finish" when contract review and execution is complete.




Click "Continue" when finished to exit the document.

STATEMENT

My work is an attempt to reveal internal struggles with Crohn's disease, a chronic illness, while referencing chaotic, often conflicting, aspects to broder life. What interests me are personal and collective movement across our southern international bonder and its implications on the physical and social experience of this isolated region. I focused on instances where I found both the persence and absence of human activity along the border: abandoned personal items, border wall ladders, and other artifacts amongst the serence landscape frozen in time. The adopted relics or visual kons of bundles and vessels investigate fleeting moments of fragmented journeys reflecting a broken condition within an allenated community. Within these aberrant sites I find myself searching for how

STATEMENT

STATEMENT
Tangier Island is located off the coast of Virginia in the
Chesapsake Bay. It is progressively being claimed by the waters
streouding it and is projected to be uninhabitable in 50 years.
When the residents are forced to evacuate, we will lose an entire
culture of people as unique as thrif dislect. This once untouched
and proad crabbing community is predicted to be one of America's
first 'climate change refugees.'

The very water the residents of Tangier depend upon to survive is swallowing them up an average of nine acres every year. Today, the island sits only 3 feet above sea deer. 18 miles wide by 3 miles long. Upon arrival by boat, it is hard to see the island off in the distance. Having fev trees left, the only marker from the bay is the water tower of Tangier that has a crab on one side and a cross on the other. This deeply religious island has already been split by the Bay's waters, which now seeps up through the ground below.

The people of Tangier have received attention from Al Gore, Donald Trump, and national media outlets, but the conversatio of future implications still needs to be had. These photographs and artist book shed light upon what is at stake when losing a

place. Tangier is not alone and sadly tells the tale many low-lying cities in the US and around the world are facing in the next 80 years. According to the National Oceanie and Armospheric Administration (NOAA) Miami, Atlantic City, New Orkans, Galveston, Charleston, South Carolina, and Virginia Beach will all be under water by 2100. My hope with this project is to inform viewers of the need to take notice now, and to think about the difficult decisions that stand before us—how will we decide who and what is worth saving? H. Jennings Sheffield was born in Richmond, Virginia. She is a contemporary artist working in lens-based media. Sheffield exceeded her Brit Probography and Digital Media from the Atlanta College of Art and her MFA from the University of Texas at San Antonio in Photography and New Media. Her core research is highly concept-driven inspired by memory, moment, and time and utilises family as the wennealtar to convey the intimacy and diverse roles individuals play throughout their life.



The methodologies utilized to create her work can take years to complete. As a result, Sheffield then takes on landscape-driven projects that begin with just he responding to the landscape with her camera. She is interested in landscapes that are fleeting. Similar to her core research, Sheffield approaches the landscapes looking for changes over time. Her work is in collections throughout the United States and is exhibited internationally

RESEARCH STATEMENT

THE ART OF BIBLICAL INTERPRETATION

Hornik, Boxall, and Dykema, SBL Press, Atlanta Georgia, October 2021

Peter and Mary Magdalene have significant encounters with Jesus that involve the strength of their faith. Peter loses his faith when he loses focus on Christ while walking on water in

Matt 14. This results in Peter falling into the Sea of Galilee, Jesus touching his hand, and restoring his faith/focus. Mary Magdalene is the first disciple to see Jesus after the resurrection but mistakes him for the gardener. Correggio captures the moment when Mary realizes who he is and Jesus tells her, "Don't touch me!" (John 20:17).

Along with Correggio, Scarsellino (1550-1620), a Ferrarese artist who produced Post- $Trent \, religious \, paintings \, in \, the \, Manner ist \, style,$ have religious iconography that anticipates the Baroque style of the next century. This study suggests that the writings of theological writer Cornelius à Lapide (1567-1637) were a source whose commentary on earlier writers may have value for an interpretation of the paintings.

The intention is to gain a better understanding of why Peter and Mary Magdalene were two of the most important Counter-Reformation penitential saints at this time in history.


This study is a chapter in the book, The Art of Biblical Interpretation: Visual Portrayals of Scriptural Narratives that I edited with Ian Boxall (Associate Professor of New

Testament, Catholic University) and Bobbi Dykema (Pastor, First Church of the Brethren, Springfield, IL) that was published in October 2021 by the Society of Biblical Literature Press.
